

Isle of Wedmore Football Club



This document supplements the various codes of conduct adopted by The Isle of Wedmore Football Club as part of the FA Level 3 club Policies and expands on the process for disciplinary fines incurred.

Youth Players:

Any conduct fines incurred by youth players of Isle of Wedmore Football Club will be handled as follows:

- The fine/fines will be sent/emailed to the parent/guardian of the respective youth player (as per the FA FAN account linked parent/guardian).
- IOWFC will pay the fine online and complete the online acknowledgment forms (accessible only by club Committee).
- The parent/guardian will then be contact to reimburse the IOWFC for the cost of the fine/fines. It is the responsibility of the guardian to ensure that the payment is made promptly on behalf of the youth player. Failure to pay within the advised time frame may result in suspension.

Adult Players:

For adult players of The Isle of Wedmore Football Club fines will be managed as follows:

- Any conduct fines will be sent directly to the individual concerned.
- Responsibility is placed upon the IOWFC Discipline manager to ensure that the fine is paid promptly within the quoted time frame.
- The adult player will then be contact to reimburse the IOWFC for the cost of the fine/fines. It is the responsibility of the player to ensure that the payment is made promptly.
- Consequences of Non-Payment:
In the event of non-payment of fines, the related player will be suspended by the club while the underlying fine remains outstanding.

General Policy:

Membership of The IOWFC automatically implies agreement with this fines policy. Non-payment of fines may result in additional disciplinary action as deemed appropriate by the club.

Additional Notes:

It is crucial that all fines are settled promptly to uphold the values and standards of The Isle of Wedmore Football Club. Failure to comply with this fines policy may result in further disciplinary measures, including potential suspension from matches and club activities.

As a not for profit voluntarily run club we do not have the funds to cover the costs of fines under any circumstances.
